Old Business: We will keep the fence at the old village hall temporarily in case we want to put up a sign and because it acts as a buffer. Occasionally cars have not made the turn from Route 134 to Route 120.

Jim Rock, village attorney, confirmed that there is no liability problem incurred by improving the various ponds.

We discussed naming different areas of the village for the purpose clarification.

We discussed changes in the 2012-2013 budget.

We looked at catalogs of benches and trashcans for Cranberry Lake. It was recommended that we put trashcans near the Cranberry Lake path at Tall Oak Drive, near Wally Stilz, Jr. home, and near Triumph Court. It was recommended that we put benches around the Cranberry Lake path in the southwest area, the northwest area and on Hainesville Road.

Dave Coulter reported that Puff Ball Mushrooms are not harmful. He will continue to research this.

New Business: It was recommended that new occupants in Cranberry Lake subdivisions get copies of the covenants regarding Cranberry Lake.

It was recommended that the village fence ordinance be amended to require all chain link fences be plastic coated with black, brown or green.
