Items that remain in this area over the winter are subject to damage from the plows and they will NOT be replaced or reimbursed by the Village! Any mailboxes that are damaged will continue to be repaired and/or replaced when necessary.

The record-breaking blizzard we experienced last season created the need to have bobcat loaders move snow back further on properties to make room for additional snow to be plowed. Let's hope there is no need for such measures this season!

## OCTOBER FIRE PREVENTION MONTH TIPS



- Replace all batteries in your smoke detectors and carbon monoxide sensors.
- Check that fire extinguishers are charged and that pins are still in place. If you do not have any fire extinguishers this is a very smart purchase for a low cost.
- Get your family together for a fire drill. Review what to do in case of fire. Be sure to cover, stay low and go, follow an escape plan and pick a place to meet after you exit the house.

### Hainesville Emergency Management Agency, EMA reminds us...

Disaster of any kind may interfere with normal supplies of food, water, heat and day-to-day necessities. It is important to keep a stock of emergency supplies on hand sufficient to meet you family's needs for at least a three day period.

Update your kit regularly. You should replace the water supply and any food that may have reached its expiration date. An easy way to remember to update your kit is to use Daylight Savings Time. When you change your clocks, you change your kits. Don't forget your pets needs!

**Fall Back! Sunday, November 6<sup>th</sup> Daylight Savings Time Ends at 2:00 a.m. Turn your clock back 1 hour!**

All voting precincts in Lake County were redrawn and renumbered as a part of the decennial redistricting which was approved at a September meeting of the Lake County Board. In November, each registered voter will be mailed a new voter card listing your new precinct number, representative districts and voting site for Election Day. All previously issued cards should be discarded.
