Hainesville History

In the year 1847, by special permission from the legislature, through the efforts of Elijah M. Haines a charter was granted for the town of Hainesville. In 1902 an election was held changing Hainesville from a town to a village.

Elijah Haines produced the first plat map of Lake County while working as a school master for the first school in Littlefort, now Waukegan. Hainesville's first schoolhouse was a log cabin built in 1846. This schoolhouse also held church services for the residents. Hainesville also once housed the train station and the post office.

In 1847, Haines met Abraham Lincoln at a convention in Chicago. In 1848, Hainesville became a toll road stop on the predecessor of Belvidere Road (Route 120), formerly known as Old Plank Road.. The wooden plank road was built to link Waukegan to McHenry County. Hainesville once had a small private cemetery, which is supposed to be located South of Cranberry Lake. There have been many attempts to locate the cemetery, but all have been unsuccessful.

Bike helmets for all ages are available at the Village Hall. Cost is \$8.00. Skater helmets are \$10.00.

Police Department:

All police calls are serviced by the Grayslake Police Dept. All emergency calls dial 911 and non-emergency calls for police service dial 847-223-2341.

Please note that parking on ANY Village Street (except for Holiday Lane) between 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. is prohibited as well as parking on the sidewalk. Any questions or

concerns please call the Grayslake Police Administration at 847-223-2341 and ask for the Police Chief.

Curfew:

The Police Department would like to remind parents that curfew is in effect throughout the year, including the summer months. The curfew for all children 17 and under, is 11:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m. Sunday through Thursday and 12:00 midnight to 6:00 a.m. Friday and Saturday.

Fire Department:

The Greater Round Lake Area and The Grayslake Fire Protection District provide both Fire and Emergency Medical Services within our village. Due to constant improvements within both departments ISO ratings have dropped over the years resulting in a reduction in homeowners insurance. CPR classes are offered by both Departments on a monthly basis.

Building Department:

The Building Department (847-223-2032) located in the Village Hall, issues permits for any building or property changes including fencing, decks, patios, sheds, paving, etc. Consult the Building Department before making any interior or exterior changes to your property. The Building Official is available to answer any of your questions by phone at 847-223-2032, email amishima@hainesville.org or by appointment. Applications are available during normal village hall hours or visit our website. If you are having a contractor doing the work, they will also need to fill out an application, provide a certificate of insurance naming the Village of Hainesville and a copy of either another

municipality's current contractor license OR \$20.

Selling Or Renting Your Home?

The Village of Hainesville requires that a **Certificate of Occupancy** be obtained by the owner for **ALL** structures—commercial, industrial, single family and town homes. A certificate of occupancy is required for any property **whenever there is a new occupant**. An inspection by the building department is required. Please call the village to make an appointment two weeks before closing. These are done on Mondays and Thursdays beginning at 7:00 a.m.

Carbon Monoxide Detector

Effective January 1, 2007 the Illinois General Assembly adopted Public Act 094-0741 requiring all residents in Illinois to have at least one approved and operating carbon monoxide detector within fifteen feet of every sleeping room. The act can be viewed at www.ilga.gov. At the time of selling your residence our building official will check and before an occupancy permit is issued you must be in compliance.

Call before you dig!

State law requires anyone, digging anywhere, to call J.U.L.I.E. (Joint Utilities Location Information for Excavators) for underground utility locations. The J.U.L.I.E. phone number is 811 "Call Before You Dig" or (1-800-892-0123). Calls are received 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. A 48 hour notice must be provided before J.U.L.I.E. will complete the utility locates. The J.U.L.I.E. operator will advise the caller of when the locates will be completed. This is a free service.

Mosquito Abatement:

Clarke Environmental is contracted by the village to combat mosquitoes. If a resident has any questions or problems with mosquitoes, calls should be directed to Clarke Environmental at 1-800-942-2555.

On-Street Parking:

Parking is **not** allowed on any Village street between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. or after two inches of snowfall. If you have overnight guests please notify the Police Dept. dispatch at 847-223-2341. For townhomes, please refer to your association for the specifics. Parking on sidewalks is a State violation and parking on lawns is a violation of Village ordinance. You can also apply for a yearly permit for On-Street parking. Call Kathy Metzler for details 847-223-2032.

Utilities:

Water and sewer accounts are established at the Village Hall. The Utility Bills are produced monthly and also include your garbage service. You may pay in person during office hours or you may use our convenient drive up drop box located on the North side of the building. New occupants should be directed to contact the Village Hall to have water bills placed in their name. The charges on your monthly Utility Bills are as follows:

Garbage Pick-Up:

Townhomes please check with your association.

The Village has contracted with Advanced Disposal for our waste hauling company. The cost is \$19.00 (\$17.00 for seniors) per month. This includes unlimited 90 gallon cart service and recycling cart. The collection day is on Wednesdays. If a holiday falls on a Monday, Tuesday, or Wednesday the collection will then be done on Thursday. Waste containers may be placed at the curb by 3 p.m. on the day prior to collection. Containers need to be removed from the curb and placed on the side of the resident home or in the garage no later than 8 p.m. on the day of collection. Townhomes must place their garbage can in the garage.

Yardwaste: STICKERS ARE NON-REFUNDABLE

Advanced Disposal is also our yardwaste hauler. They will pickup unlimited amount of bags as long as a yard-waste tag is purchased and displayed on each of the bags. You may purchase a tag for \$2.25 and they are available at the Village Hall, Hainesville Walgreens, 7-Eleven and Ace Hardware in Grayslake and Round Lake. **Important** to tell counter person at Ace you live in Hainesville. Available for the 2013 yardwaste season is a subscription service. You are allowed up to 6 bags/containers for collection each week. If you are interested in the subscription service, contact Advanced Disposal @ 847-623-3870.

Lawn Sprinkling Restrictions:

Village-wide lawn sprinkling restrictions went into effect July 15, 1996. Under the lawn

sprinkling restrictions, odd numbered houses may water on odd number calendar days. Even numbered houses may water on even numbered calendar days. Holiday Lane Only Townhome address is determined by the first two digits. Cranberry Lake North and Union Square Townhome are determined by the complete address numbers are odd/even. No watering allowed between 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Lawn sprinkling and outdoor watering of trees, shrubs, etc., is restricted to the permitted days and hours. Children’s sprinklers may be used not to exceed two hours in usage. Newly seeded or sodded lawns may be watered for the first two weeks not to exceed four hours per day. The watering restrictions are strictly enforced and fines are imposed. Questions call 847-223-2032 for clarification.

Ordinance:

Boats, their trailers, campers, etc. may be temporarily stored in driveways from April 1 to October 31 only. Ordinance 99-5-1

Snowmobiles and their trailers

may be temporarily stored in driveways between November 1 and March 31 only. No storage is allowed on nonpaved surfaces or side yards, except, in some cases, behind a privacy fence.

Pets:

The State of Illinois and the Village require all animals to be licensed (in the form of a rabies tag). Your veterinarian will supply these. Owners of dogs and cats are required to abide by the

Leash Law whenever an animal is off the owner's property. "Running at Large" is a violation of local ordinance. Additionally, owners are responsible for the removal of their animal's waste from public or private property. The village only allows 4 dogs or cats per household.
