NEW BABY OAKS IN CRANBERRY LAKE

Baby oak trees were recently planted in the Cranberry Lake woodlands by our residents with the help of National Honor Society members of Round Lake and Grayslake Central High Schools.

The purpose of this effort is to help Mother Nature maintain the sustainability of Cranberry Lake and its woodlands, a natural preserve protected by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. Several mature oaks (hundreds of years old) were destroyed when the Tornado on August 2nd went through Hainesville. In addition, trees naturally die and need to be replaced.

Special thanks to Dave Coulter of Native Restoration Services for providing the trees, time and expertise. Many thanks to John, owner of Grayslake Feed on Center Street and Ken, owner of Chain O Lakes Lumber on Route 134 for donating needed material for the project. Please support our event sponsors.

DRUG TAKE BACK DAY

Saturday, April 30th from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

The Grayslake-Hainesville Police Department and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) will give the public its 11th opportunity in six years to prevent pill abuse and theft by ridding their homes of potentially dangerous expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs. Bring your pills for disposal to the Hainesville Village Hall located at 100 N. Hainesville Road or the Grayslake Police Department located at 10 South Seymour Avenue in Grayslake. (The DEA cannot accept liquids or needles or sharps, only pills or patches.) The service is free and anonymous, no questions asked.

REMINDER: WATER RATE INCREASE EFFECTIVE MAY 2016 WILL BE REFLECTED ON YOUR JUNE 2016 UTILITY BILL

Effective May 2016, the monthly base rate for 8,000 gallons will be raised from \$26.60 to \$36.60 for a total increase of \$10 monthly. The rate for each additional 1,000 gallons will remain the same at \$3.50. The summer sewer policy still remains in effect. You will see this increase reflected starting on your June utility bill for May usage.

NEW SEWER BILLING CODES, SAME OLD CHARGES!

You may have seen some changes to your last water bill. Some of our billing codes have recently changed. We had previously coded all 3 of our sewer fees as SW. Residents would normally see 2 SW charges on their bill which has led to the question "why am I being double billed for sewer usage?" Hainesville residents are actually connected to 1 of 2 different treatment plants, the Fox Lake Sanitary District or the North Shore Sanitary District. The Fox Lake Sewer will now be coded as FS; North Shore Sewer will now be coded as NS. Every bill has the Hainesville Sewer fee which will now be coded HS. We have changed the codes for these billing items to better educate our residents about the breakdown of their bill.
