Leaf Vacuum Service

Leaf vacuum service will be offered the last 6 weeks of yard waste pick-up, on Wednesdays, the same day as your trash, recycling and yard waste service starting 10/19. The last pick-up will be 11/30. Please be aware that due to the volume of leaves any particular week, the leaf collection truck may not always arrive at your home the same time each week. Please have your leaves ready for pick-up by 6:30 a.m. on Wednesdays.

INSTRUCTIONS: Residents should rake their leaves in a pile or row within 3 feet of the curb but remaining well off the street. Please make sure to keep the leaves on the parkway and not in the street. Please do not mix large tree branches, grass, or brush with your pile of leaves as these items will damage the vacuum truck. **If the weather won't cooperate & there is bad weather on a Wednesday, the leaves will be picked up the very next day or ASAP.**

Accepted Residential Electronic Items

Cable Receivers, Cameras, CD Players, Computers (Including tablets), Computer Drives, Cords and Cables, Digital Video Disc Players, Digital Video Disc Recorders, Electronic Keyboards, Electronic Mice, Facsimile Machines, Holiday Lights, Modems, Monitors, Portable Digital Music Players, Printers, Satellite Receivers, Scanners, Shredders, Small Scale Servers, Stereos, Tablets, Telephones, Televisions, Video Cassette Recorders & Video Game Consoles.

Items listed above in bold are prohibited by State law from being disposed of in the trash.

Air Conditioners, Batteries (alkaline, non-rechargeable, lead acid, sump pump), Broken Glass, Computer Discs (Floppy & CD), Dehumidifiers, Electric Fixtures, Fluorescent Light Bulbs, Large Household Appliances, Liquid or Chemical Waste, Microwave Ovens, Paint Cans, Packaging Materials, Fire Extinguishers, Refrigerators, Small Household Appliances, Smoke and Fire Detectors, VHS/Cassette Tapes, CD's, DVD's (including cases) and Wood Speaker Cabinets

- **September 29, 2016** First day to mail a ballot. First day for early voting at the Lake County Clerk's office.
- **October 11, 2016** Close of Voter Registration at the office of municipal and township clerks and with deputy registrars and agencies.
- **October 12, 2016** Grace Period Registration and voting begins.
- **October 24, 2016** First day for early voting.
- **November 3, 2016** Last day to request a ballot by mail.
- **November 5, 2016** Last day for early voting at non-state mandated sites (Antioch Twp Office, Ela Twp Office, Fremont Public Library, Highland Park Police Station, Lake Barrington Village Hall, Lake County Central Permit Facility, Lake Forest City Hall, Round Lake Village Hall, Vernon Twp Office, Zion City Hall)
- **November 7, 2016** Last day for early voting at state mandated extended hour sites (Gurnee Village Hall, Jane Addams Center, Lake County Clerk's Office, Lake County Courthouse and Administrative Complex, North Chicago City Hall)
- **November 8, 2016** GENERAL ELECTION (last day for Grace Period Registration and voting)

Packets are available during office hours which are Monday, Tuesday and Thursday, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and Friday 9:00 a.m. to Noon, Closed on Wednesday's. The April 4th, 2017 Consolidated Election will include the following offices to be elected: Village Mayor – 4-year term of office, Village Trustee – 3 Trustees, each for a 4-year term of office. The first date to circulate the nominating petition packets is Tuesday, September 20th, 2016 thru Monday, December 19th, 2016. The first day to file your Nominating Petition Packets at the Village of Hainesville is on Monday, December 12th, 2016 at 9:00 a.m. and the last day to file is Monday, December 19th, 2016 at 5:00 p.m.
