## **Out with the Old, Make room for the New!**

**Electronics** do not belong in your regular trash but cannot be placed in your recycling cart either. All residential electronics may be dropped off at a special electronics recycling bin located at the Hainesville Public Works Department adjacent to the Village Hall on the south side of Hainesville Road.

### **Clothing and Textiles Recycling**

It is estimated that nearly 85% of all clothing and textiles end up in landfills in the U.S. today. The EPA estimates that the average person throws away 70 pounds of clothing each year. Textile and clothing waste is a significant problem in our country. It is estimated that anywhere from 5-10% of all waste that is sent to municipal landfills is comprised of textiles. These items are often very dense and consume significant landfill space.

A special white bin just for this purpose is also available at the Hainesville Public Works Department on the southeast corner of the parking lot. The program will accept new, gently used, used or unwanted/worn, women's, men's and children's clothing and textiles. All fabrics will be accepted. Even clothes or textiles with stains or holes will be accepted. The great news too, is that almost 95% of the materials collected will be repurposed or recycled.

## **REMINDER: Provide Feedback about Paratransit Travel Needs in Lake County**
