Trick-or-Treating hours: 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

(Leave your front outside lights on if you wish to invite trick-or-treaters.)

Village Hayrides (two drivers) will be available as follows:

Centennial Drive (Cranberry Lake) behind Village Hall, 4:00 p.m. to 5:30 p.m.

Brittany Park (Misty Hill by water tower), 4:00 p.m. to 5:30 p.m.

North area of Deer Point Trails (where Washington Street Bike Path entrance intersects East Big Horn Drive), 5:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Antler Park, Deerview Drive, south area, Deer Point Trails, 5:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

KEEPING OUR STREETS CLEAN!

Please do not blow leaves or grass clippings into the street as it clogs the sewers.

Leaf Vacuum Service

Leaf vacuum service will be offered from 10/25 through 11/29. The leaves will be picked up on Wednesdays, the same day as your trash, recycling and yard waste service. starting 10/25. Please be aware that due to the volume of leaves any particular week, the leaf collection truck may not always arrive at your home the same time each week. Please have your leaves ready for pick-up by 6:30 a.m. on Wednesdays.

INSTRUCTIONS: Residents should rake their leaves into a pile or row within 3 feet of the curb but remaining well off the street. Please make sure to keep the leaves on the parkway and not in the street. Please do not mix large tree branches, grass, or brush with your pile of leaves as these items will damage the vacuum truck. **If the weather doesn't cooperate & there is bad weather on a Wednesday, the leaves will be picked up the very next day or ASAP.**

RV and Boat Parking Ordinance: Boats, their trailers, campers, etc. may be temporarily stored in driveways from April 1st to October 31st ONLY. Snowmobiles and their trailers may be temporarily stored in driveways between November 1st and March 31st only.

Storage is not allowed on non-paved surfaces nor in side yards, except, in some cases, when placed behind a privacy fence.

Snowmobiling anywhere in the Village is strictly prohibited!

MY TALK WITH ELIJAH HAINES

Elijah Haines, founder of Hainesville, attended our 3rd Annual Civil War Re-enactment September 16th and 17th, as he has each of the prior years.

When he sat down under the tent at the information booth, I had a chance to ask him the questions that had been bothering me since moving here 15 years ago. Maybe you wondered, too?

Why did you make Hainesville so small? When you had the chance, why didn't you add a big lake like Grayslake or Highland Lake?

He explained, "I envisioned the purpose for Hainesville to be the service center for the area farmers. Therefore, I wanted the General Store, the Post Office, the Blacksmith and the School to be easy access to the farmers." Obviously, those establishments don't exist here anymore.

That made perfect sense to me and I hope these answers satisfy you, as well.
