YARD WASTE SEASON – SINGLE FAMILY HOMES

Yard waste season runs from April 1st thru November 28th, 2018. Yard waste may be disposed of in a paper disposable yard waste bag or a standard marked yard waste container. Branches may be bundled. They may not exceed 4 feet in length, 18 inches in diameter or weigh over 50 pounds.

ELECTRONIC RECYCLING COLLECTION

The electronic recycling dumpster continues to be available and maintained by Advanced Disposal at the Public Works Building on the south side of the Village Hall. Please remember electronics cannot be placed curbside but can be placed in the bin at Public Works.

NORTHEAST CENTRAL SEWER SYSTEM RATE INCREASE

Lake County Public Works Department has notified the Village that due to rate modifications by the North Shore Sewer District there will be a sewer rate increase. This increase will be passed on to the residents. Effective April 1, 2018 all customers of the County's Northeast Central Sewer System (all of Deer Point Trails Subdivisions and Misty Hill Subdivision) will see this increase.

The first bill that will include this increase will be issued on May 15, 2018.

For the residents living in Misty Hill Farms, Deer Point Trails, The Sanctuary and The Settlement, the sewer rate will increase from \$4.994 per thousand gallons to \$5.481 per thousand gallons. The total increase is \$0.487 per thousand gallons.

YOU CAN HELP SAVE MONARCH BUTTERFLIES

Mayor Gerry Daley just signed the "Mayors' Monarch Pledge" from the National Wildlife Federation, which indicates our desire to help save the beautiful monarch butterfly because 90 percent of the monarch population has been lost in the last 20 years. Scientists attribute the decline to a loss of summer breeding habitat in the U.S. and loss of winter habitat in Mexico.

You can help restore the monarch population by planting specific flowers in your gardens and around your homes. Plants in the milkweed family act as hosts, a particular favorite is the perennial butterfly weed. It has beautiful orange flowers in summer and only grows to about two feet. Other great perennials are Columbine and Sweet William bloom in the spring; Purple Cone Flowers for summer and Asters for fall. Zinnias are great summer annuals.

The Village will be planting more butterfly-friendly plants in our medians and other Village gardens.
