## **EARTH DAY VILLAGE CLEAN UP**

Our annual Village clean-up will be Earth Day, Sunday, April 22<sup>nd</sup> at 10 a.m. and Sunday, April 29<sup>th</sup> will be the rain date.

We will meet at the corner of Hainesville Road and Tall Oak Drive. Trash bags, latex gloves and safety vests will be issued and you will be assigned an area. The number of assignments will be determined by how many volunteers are available. At a minimum, we will do both sides of Hainesville Road and the path around Cranberry Lake.

If you are interested in cleaning up around your neighborhood, you may pick up supplies at the Village Hall during the week prior to clean-up Sunday. Just remember the change in Village office hours. We are now open on Wednesdays and closed on Fridays.

Anyone needing community service hours is especially welcome. Volunteers of all ages are welcome, but children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult.

The Village will host a pizza party for the volunteers after the clean-up. ## **NORTHEAST CENTRAL SEWER SYSTEM RATE INCREASE**

Lake County Public Works Department has notified the Village that due to rate modifications by the North Shore Sewer District there will be a sewer rate increase. This increase will be passed on to the residents. Effective April 1, 2018 all customers of the County's Northeast Central Sewer System (all of Deer Point Trails Subdivisions and Misty Hill Subdivision) will see this increase.

The first bill that will include this increase will be issued on May 15, 2018.

For the residents living in Misty Hill Farms, Deer Point Trails, The Sanctuary and The Settlement, the sewer rate will increase from \$4.994 per thousand gallons to \$5.481 per thousand gallons. The total increase is \$0.487 per thousand gallons.

#### **GET FIT!**

The Grayslake Community Park District is excited to announce **GO** Grayslake, a new community movement designed to increase community health through activity, education and collaboration. Former U.S. Surgeon General Dr. Vivek H. Murphy has challenged people of all ages to walk at least 30 minutes each day and Grayslake has partnered with the Lake County Health Department on its county-wide initiative to improve the health of Lake County residents by enhancing and increasing the shared experience of walking.

The **GO** Grayslake walking initiative seeks to have everyone make a commitment to take a 30-minute walk each day during the month of May as a start. They have planned a kickoff event on Sunday, May 6<sup>th</sup> at 11 a.m. in Central Park (250 Library Lane, Grayslake) to walk together as a community.

Though only half of Hainesville is in the jurisdiction of the Grayslake Park District, the Village of Hainesville as a whole is supporting this initiative as a way to increase the health of all of its residents. Hainesville will have a booth at the event and several of the Trustees have already registered for the walking event.
