VILLAGE WATER RATE INCREASE

The Village Board of Trustees have amended the water use rates. The new rates will be effective May 1, 2018. The current water charge of \$36.60 for up to 8,000 gallons has been increased to \$37.00 up to 8,000 gallons. Each additional 1,000 gallons used was charged at \$3.50 per 1,000 gallons and has been increased to \$4.62 per 1,000 gallons. The new rates will be reflected starting on your June bill and thereafter.
