CIVIL WAR EVENT A GREAT SUCCESS!

On the weekend of September 8th and 9th, Hainesville was treated to its annual Civil War Encampment & Battle. Approximately 800 people enjoyed seeing historic presentations from portrayals of such luminaries as Abraham Lincoln, Jefferson Davis, General Grant, Major General Thomas, and Elijah Haines (Village Founder). After their presentations, they, along with Thomas Morris Chester (the only black war reporter of a major Civil War newspaper), were available to the event visitors to answer questions about their characters and the times in which they lived. It provided a great history lesson.

Likewise, visitations to the military and civilian camps, as well as viewing the battlefield surgical demonstration and the narrated battle, provided an enjoyable and informative experience thanks to the military and civilian re-enactors.

Many thanks also to Mike DePouw and his stalwart crew whose support was invaluable and greatly appreciated before, during and after the event. LEAF VACUUM SERVICES - YARD WASTE PICK-UP

Leaf vacuuming service will be offered on Wednesdays starting 10/24 and ending on 11/28. Please be aware that due to the volume of leaves any particular week, the leaf collection truck may not always arrive at your home the same time each week. Please have your leaves ready for pickup by 6:30 a.m. on Wednesdays.

INSTRUCTIONS: Leaves should be raked into a pile or row within 3 feet of the curb but remaining well off the street. Please make sure to keep the leaves on the parkway and not in the street. Please do not mix large tree branches, grass, or brush with your pile of leaves as these items will damage the vacuum truck. **If the weather won't cooperate & there is bad weather on a Wednesday, the leaves will be picked up the very next day or ASAP.**
